### **The Reverend Dr. Donnie Rufus Woods**

Donnie was born and grew up in Louisville, MS where his parents and family (18 siblings) were farmers. He is a product of the 1970's school integration experiment and graduated from Noxapater High School in 1973. The church has always been a centerpiece of his life since baptism and profession of faith.

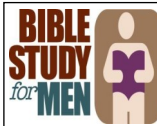
He received an AA degree at Mary Holmes College, West Point, MS (1979); a BA degree at Mississippi State University, Starkville, MS (1981); a Master of Divinity degree at Johnson C. Smith Theological Seminary (ITC), Atlanta, GA (1985); and a Doctor of Divinity degree (Honoris Causa) at Johnson C. Smith Seminary (2005). Donnie was ordained by Tropical Florida Presbytery in October 1985. During the first fourteen years of ordained ministry, he served pastorates in Florida, Georgia, and North Carolina.

In July 1998, he was called as the Designated Associate Executive Presbyter/Stated Clerk of CAP; and elected Executive Presbyter/Stated Clerk in 2001. He continues to serve the presbytery under the new title General Presbyter/Pastor to Pastors. Donnie is married to Teresa Woods and they have three children.
